Internship: Environmental Field Internship.

Duration: 1 to 4 Months

Start Dates: Start dates year round, allow 6 weeks minimum for application processing time.

The Organization: Intern in with an independent not for profit organization committed to the protection of Australian biodiversity. It specifically aims to identify and acquire private land and water of outstanding natural significance and high biodiversity value, and to manage that land and water for the benefit of all, aiming to provide a non-confrontational and practical solution to conservation needs.

Tasks Include:

- Support on-ground reserve management tasks, including infrastructure support, management of volunteer groups and administrative tasks.
- Provide on-ground support in a range of conservation and land management initiatives being undertaken on private conservation land throughout the Australian outback under the supervision of a on-site Reserve Manager.
- Undertake monitoring, mapping and surveying of indigenous and exotic animals to support long-term conservation management.
- Support and provide guidance on the Reserve Management Plan, conservation projects and their implementation.

- Eager learner from age 18-30 years
- Understanding of ecology/biology
- Basic mapping and/or GIS skills preferable
